Practitioners may also manually turn the wheel and accumulate merit for special requests. **Cost: each ger will cost \$15,000; the korlo cost \$15,000. Total - \$45,000**

Choekor Pagoda & Amatayus Mandala: We have created the Choekor Pagoda to house a permanent Amatayus mandala constructed by the monks of Drepung Loseling Monastery. This mandala is placed on the tikpu that was previously used to hold the Kalachakra mandala created during His Holiness the Dalai Lama's visit to the center in 1999 when he gave the Kalachakra Empowerment. The Choekor Pagoda features a sacred *Mani Wheel* which rotates continually on solar power and contains 613,635,000 copies of mantras to deities and teachers such as Chenrezig, Manjushri, Vajrapani, Tara, and Lama Tsong Khapa. **Cost: \$8,000.**

Kora Meditation Path: The Kora Meditation Trail at the Tibetan Mongolian Buddhist Cultural Center winds around the TMBCC property. It is approximately 1.8 miles in length. Since this land has been blessed by His Holiness the Dalai Lama of Tibet and since the Kora Meditation trail goes around two sacred stupas (tib. *chorten*), a practitioner will accumulate merit if he or she circumambulates the path in a prayerful, meditative manner. We request donations to maintain the path and purchase benches to be placed in strategic sites. **Cost: approximately \$1,000.**

Ritak Po Mo and Temple Ornaments: The ornaments on top of the Kumbum Chamtse Ling Temple, in particular the Riktak Po Mo (male and female deer on either side of the Dharma Wheel) are badly cracked and in need of repair. Much merit is gained by donating to the maintenance of these Dharma objects. **Cost: approximately \$12,000.**

Cultural Preservations Programs: Each year we hold at the TMBCC programs to educate the public about the cultures of Tibet and Mongolian.
